During an Auslan interpreted performance, an interpreter stands in a clearly visible location to the audience, and interprets the spoken word and sound effects for Deaf patrons who require Auslan.

What is Audio Description?

An Audio Describer delivers a live commentary via a personal headset providing information on the visual elements of a performance as it unfolds.

Please request headsets when booking to ensure availability. Headsets can be collected in foyers of each venue near box office – from one hour prior to show time.

In conjunction with audio description, these shows also offer touch tours an hour prior to the start time. If you would like to participate in these, please let BASS staff know when booking your tickets.


