ONLINE

We are so excited to be able to offer online access bookings across select shows in 2024. This mode of sale offers wheelchair seats/platforms, Companion Card, Audio Described and Auslan Interpreted prices.

Use this link to automatically apply the 'ACCESS' code to your cart.

Once you select your show, performance date and time, you will see a seat map. Use the + and - symbols in the bottom right corner to zoom.

There are small symbols above the seat icon that demonstrate the seat type. You can also see the written price types when you click the individual seat.

The pre-cart message will confirm the seat type you have chosen.

If you are booking a wheelchair seat or space, or a companion card ticket, you will receive a courtesy call from a member of our Customer Experience team to make sure we pass on accurate information to the venue.




